




The AMX mixing valve cuts installation time and number of parts in half.

Vermont Codes

Section 501.2 — (Use AM-1, AMX, or MX Series to meet this code.)

Water Heater and Space Heater, where a combination of potable water and space heating systems requires water for space heating at temperatures higher than 140° F (60° C), a master thermostatic mixing valve complying with ASSE 1017 shall be provided to limit the water supplied to the potable hot water distribution system to a temperature of 120° F (40°C) or less. The potability of the water shall be maintained throughout the system.

Section 502.1 — (Use AM-1, AMX, or MX Series to meet this code.)

Water heaters shall maintain a minimum water temperature of 140° F (60° C).

Section 602.2 — (Use AM-1, AM 1070, AMX, UMV or MX Series to meet this code.)

Potable water required: Only potable water shall be supplied to plumbing fixtures that provide water for drinking, bathing or culinary purposes, or for the processing of food, medical or pharmaceutical products. Unless otherwise required by law, potable water shall be supplied to all plumbing fixtures at a maximum temperature of 120° F (49° C).
